APPLICATION GUIDELINES AND CHECKLIST

Application Deadline is June 30th (postmarked) of the students Junior year of high school

The Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarship Trust Fund awards scholarships to students of color, preferably African American, who reside and attend school in New London County, in order that they may pursue their education at the post secondary level. The criteria for selecting scholars include community service, academic achievement, financial need, and United States citizenship. The Scholarship Committee will interview all candidates chosen for consideration. To be considered a viable candidate, the following documents **must** be received or postmarked by June 30th of the students' junior year in high school. We prefer that the application and all attachments arrive in one packet if possible.

- Completed** application (all sections including financial information must be filled in on form)
- Essay** (completed and signed by the applicant)
- Three letters** of recommendation (1. school, 2. community, and 3. personal/not related)
- Official **school transcripts** showing all semesters including your junior year
- SAT and/or ACT Scores** (Optional)
- Photo/Video Release Form (Found on the application website)
- A copy of this Application Checklist

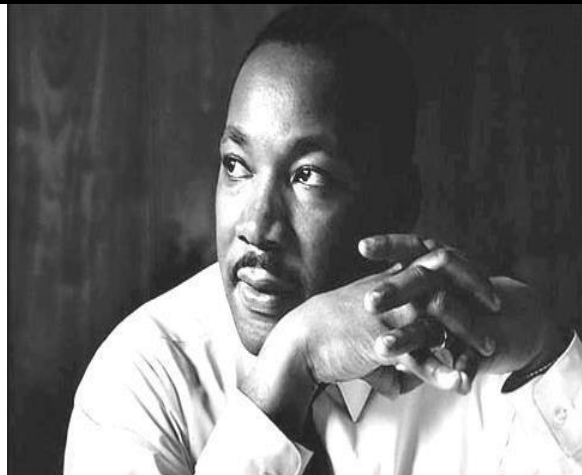

Your essay must be no longer than 1 page, formatted in 12-point Times New Roman font, with 1-inch margins and double spaced.

The Scholarship Committee will interview all candidates chosen for consideration.

In order to be considered as a viable candidate, you must submit the following:

1. Your completed application signed by student and parent
2. Your completed essay
3. Three letters of recommendation (1. school 2. community 3. personal/not related)
4. Official transcripts showing all semesters including your junior year
5. Your class standing
6. Your SAT and or ACT scores (Optional)
7. Release of information Form
